

Comparative Religions

Course Description

This class begins by looking at the basic unifying beliefs that form the foundation to the false religions and cults throughout history. It then takes a historical and systematic approach to the study of the major religions in the world and that the students are most likely to encounter. In addition to this, it looks at how these beliefs have shaped the secular culture that we live in today.

Class Materials

Every day, students are required to bring to class paper and pencil or pen. Failure to do so will affect one's ability to do well on the quizzes and tests. NO laptops, tablets, or phones.

Coursework

Homework (10%): About one assignment per week involving reading and videos from other religions.

Quizzes (30%): There will be a quiz every fourth school day over the material covered in class. Quizzes will not be allowed to be made up after the unit test.

Tests (60%): There will be a test at the end of every unit (usually every two or three weeks).

Each student can monitor their own class grades through the RenWeb system. Homework assignments will be posted on RenWeb at the end of each Friday for the following week.
